

How to Make Fizzy Flour Paint

- Flour
- Baking soda
- Food coloring (You can use liquid watercolors instead if your batch doesn't have to be taste-safe.)
- Water
- Vinegar in a squeeze bottle

toothpicks for stirring

container for the paint: plastic egg carton, muffin tin, baby food jars or other containers on hand.

Don't have baking soda or don't care to make fizzy paint? Here's a [non-fizzy version of flour paint!](#)

1 tablespoon of flour into four compartments of the egg carton

add about half a tablespoon of baking soda to each.

To make sure that the colors were bright, mixed the base ingredients with a generous half tablespoon of food coloring for each color.

Add 1 tablespoon of water per color and stir with a toothpick.

Interestingly, the amount of water it took to make a smooth consistency varied greatly between colors.

Add more water if needed to make a smooth consistency. It may depend on how much food color you added to get the depth of color you wanted.

Stop here and paint. Add a squeeze of vinegar to fizz while you paint
